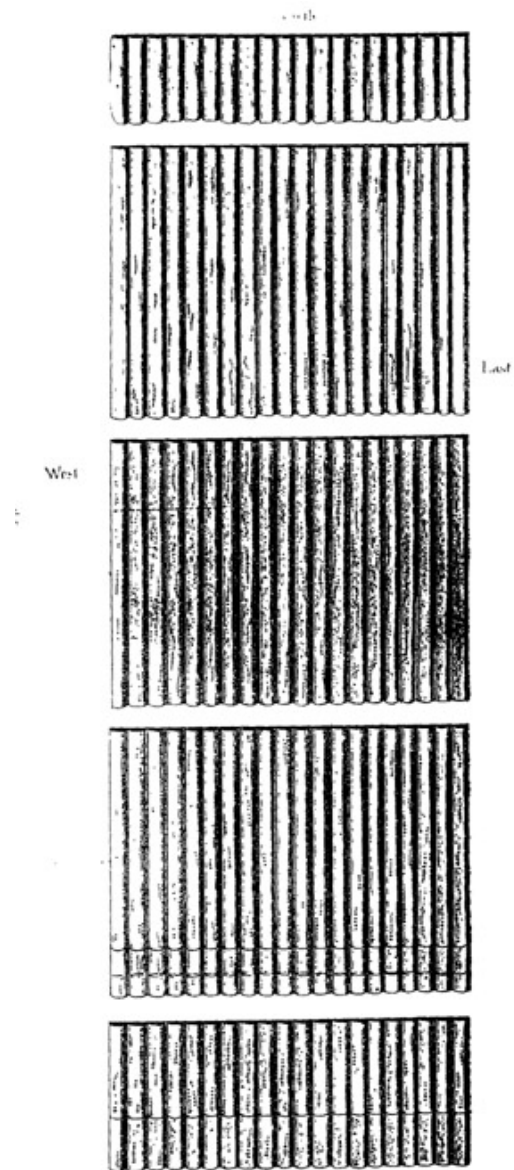

**ILLUSTRATION 10 IS FIGURE 4 FROM NATIVE AMERICAN ANTHROPOLOGIST HENRY SCHOOLCRAFT’S HISTORICAL AND STATISTICAL INFORMATION REFLECTING THE HISTORY, CONDITION AND PROSPECTS OF THE INDIAN TRIBES OF THE UNITED STATES, PART I, , 1845 SHOWS THAT NORTH NATIVE AMERICANS THE VALLEYS OF THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES ALSO EMPLOYED THE SUSTAINABLE AGRO-FORESTRY GARDEN TECHNOLOGY.**

**ILLUSTRATION 10** above shows an Ancient ***Sustainable Agro-Forest*** with **Deep Planting Beds** each measuring 100 feet by 6 feet with 1 foot pathways first described in 1825 in Saint Joseph River Valley, Michigan, built by Native Americans including the ***Miami Indians*** of Indiana, Ohio, Michigan and Illinois since destroyed and nearly forgotten. In the early 19<sup>th</sup> Century there was a 300 acre **SAF garden** at the ***Miami Indian Nation’s*** Capital at ***“Blackberry Patch”*** now called Fort Defiance, IN.
